Significant in many contexts

Many cases around race and gender bias involve unspoken issues of trust

Foundational

It has been a main theme in many visitation & custody disputes. I also have seen it in conflict coaching.

Highly critical

Trust is everything in mediation. At least in the mediator, but ultimately in the other party, to reach an agreement.

Necessary for psychological safety

Very important

The distrust that people bring to the initial discussion makes it really hard to get barriers lowered so that real communication can happen.

The lack of trust causes the parties to ascribe negative intentions to each other's behaviors.

Highly critical

Shuts down possibilities

Significant. Particularly when assessing if informal mediation is appropriate - I ask about level of trust.

Trust is crucial to coming to a resolution. Parties must trust the other party to hold up their end of the bargain.

important but not readily attainable

Either trust has been broken in the past or has never been established and needs to be built

Without trust there is no true listening and no true creativity or even effort to solve a problem at any level above purely transactional.

It is critical

Participants often don't trust one another, and don't trust the process.

They don't believe what is said.

If you don't trust you don't usually answer honestly

In every situation in the workplace, as an organizational ombuds

When there is a power differential, there is low trust from lesser-power party

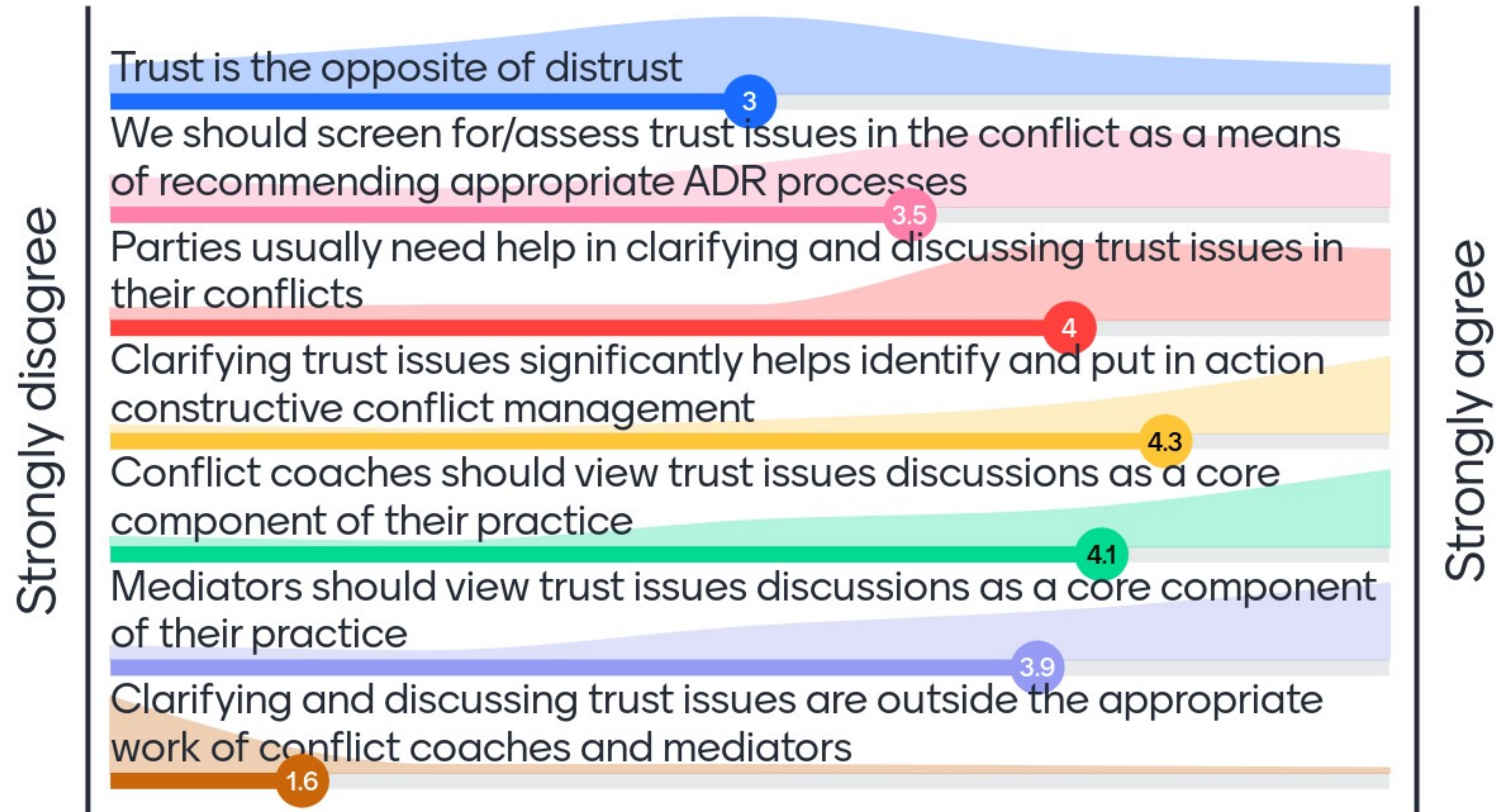
Distrust of other party is the nature of conflict
